Mayor - Timothy M. Flinchum

Councilman - Terry M. Bennett



I taught at Ashe Central High School in Ashe County, NC. And, at Greer High School in Greer, SC. I'm a retired Special Education Teacher from the WSFC Schools. I was the Transition Coordinator/Special Populations Coordinator for the WSFC Schools when I retired. I also worked at North Forsyth High School with the Sports Medicine Program from 1998-2005.
