Garden Tips for December: Dig over empty borders and prepare your soil for next year's planting.

Bare-root season begins late this month. Plant cane berries, grapes and roots of perennials, such as Artichoke, Asparagus, Rhubarb, Astilbe and Peony, now.

Look after the birds - clean feeders, stock up on wild bird food and make sure they have access to fresh water.
