Town Manager Misty Meadows Resigns

Misty Meadows resigned as the Town Manager for Rural Hall on January 19, 2023. Misty has worked for the Town of Rural Hall since 2004. She has worked as the Events Coordinator, Administrative Assistant, Town Clerk, and was hired as Town Manager in December 2021.

During her time as town manager, she was responsible for organizing the many events in town, such as the concerts, Easter Egg Hunt, Fourth of July Fireworks, the Summer Splash, the Food Trucks Tuesdays, National Night Out, Dawg with the Deputy, the Tree Lighting Event, and the Christmas Parade.

Misty was also responsible for working with Lt. Little of the Forsyth County Sheriff's Department and other agencies to improve conditions for the residents of the Woodbriar Apartments. For Thanksgiving, the town, with Lt. Little's assistance, provided over 30 meals to residents at Woodbriar and Rural Hill Apartments. Also, this year the Town of Rural Hall provided Christmas Gifts for over 16 families.

As Town Manager, Misty managed the operations and administration for our town. She was also responsible for implementing policies that were voted on by the Town Council, reporting to the Council on operations and finances.

While you are outside pruning, cut some forsythia, quince, hawthorn, winter jasmine, or cherry branches to add color indoors. Order flower seeds to start in pots if you haven't already. Did You Know??...

Town Ordinance #379 Unlawful Discharge of a Firearm

It shall be unlawful for any person to fire or discharge a gun, rifle, pistol or other firearm, within the town except in case of necessary defense of person or property: provided that this section not apply to an officer lawfully discharging his duty; provided further, that nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit licensed shooting galleries; provided that this section shall not apply to the use of any air rifle, air gun, air pistol, or pellet gun.

New Speed Limit on Church Street

Watch your speed!

The 25mph speed limit signs have been installed on Church St, between Summit St and Park St and Park St and Peso St. Yellow "park entrance" signs have been added to the speed limit signs by the park. The three brown directive signs guiding people to Covington Park, located at 65 and Church St, Park St and Broad St, and Park St and Church St, have all been updated to blue to help better guide people to the park. A digital speed limit trailer has been placed on Church Street across from the park.

Please watch your speed and as always, watch for children playing in the area.
