State Auditor's Report

On November 30, 2022 the Rural Hall Town Council, along with the Town's Interim Attorney and selected staff members met with State Auditor Beth Wood and her staff for a confidential exit conference and review of their draft audit report about the Town. The Interim Town attorney responded to the draft report; however, the State Auditor rejected the exhibits which the Interim Town attorney wanted to include in the Town's response for context and completeness. The State Auditor's investigation determined that there are no missing or misspent funds but did identify some areas where they felt the Town could improve in its governance and financial processes.

The State Auditor's report was published online on Wednesday, February 22, 2023, and can be found at https://www.auditor.nc.gov/audits-reviews/all-other-reports/investigative-audits. The Town has also published the report on our website, along with our response to the Auditor's findings including the exhibits which the State Auditor refused to include in the Town's response. The Town Council has appointed interim leadership that is working to address all concerns identified, and we are committed to being transparent with the public in sharing these findings with you, and also letting you know how we intend to address each of the areas identified in the Auditor's report. Interim Manager Ron Niland (manager@townofruralhall.com) and Interim Finance Director Homer Dearmin (financedirector@ruralhall.com) welcome any questions about the Auditor's report and Town's response that you may have, and wish to assure the public that the Town of Rural Hall's staff and elected leaders are working daily to ensure that Town operations meet the expectations of our citizens and agencies with oversight.



Rural Hall Fire Department

Exciting Changes Ahead...

The Rural Hall Fire Department located near the intersection of College Street and SR-65 was constructed in 1941. In 1988 the station was renovated, to include an addition. The total area of the building is 12,152 square feet, of which 5,112 square feet is apparatus bays. In 2019, a space needs assessment was conducted, and the Town began discussing the need for a new Fire Department building. In January 2023, Fire Chief Mike Simone and his Command Staff, along with Interim Town Manager Ron Niland and Interim Finance Director Homer Dearmin interviewed design and construction firms. Bobbitt Construction has been identified as the company recommended to our Town Council to partner with for the construction of a new building. Representatives of the company came to the February Town Council Meeting, and following their presentation, the Council agreed to move forward as suggested. Site and building design work will begin in the coming weeks. Currently this project is in the informative stages. Once a timeline is set, we will be communicating plans with the public, and seeking public participation and input throughout the design and construction process. We are excited about the possibility of a new facility that will serve our Town and the surrounding fire tax district for many years to come.

Rural Hall Garden Club

March is unpredictable, even in relatively warm climates. Spring may have a strong foothold in March but wet soils and frost warnings will remind you that your garden is still working under limitations. It is still a good time to start seeds indoors. Plants like tomatoes, lettuces, squash, and eggplant are good choices. Remember to keep seeds moist but not overly wet or dry. The last frost date for our area zone 7b. is April 15th. If you are considering early blooming flowers consider the hardy Helleborus. They bloom as early in spring as they possibly can. Because some varieties can bloom as early as January and February, hellebores can be one of the earliest sources of pollen for bees. They are slowgrowing, evergreen, deer-resistant perennials. If you are not particular about the color, you can find seed packets of mixed blends. You will have to wait a few years for seed-grown hellebores to bloom, but once they are established, they can live for decades.

Our March meeting will be March 27th. at 7PM at the Nazareth Lutheran Church, 460 Bethania-Rural Hall Rd. Our February guest speaker from the Kordick Family Farm gave a wonderful presentation on growing heirloom apples as well as regional cider apple varieties care and harvesting.

Our family garden club has been organized for Rural Hall and surrounding area to help promote Rural Hall's theme, "Garden Spot of the World." Men, women and children (ages 12 and up) are welcome and invited to join us. The club has several activities in the planning stages and committee selections for Spring plant sales, planting the hanging baskets for town, yard of the month, tending to the library, post office, and town hall beds. Most enjoyable in addition to the informative club meetings are the pot luck dinners and tours of our friendly members gardens and grounds. These tours run May through September and make for a most enjoyable evening. Come and join us in the garden.
